My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

With this letter, I am pleased to announce the weekend of May 17 and 18, 2025, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, as Diocesan Mission Sunday.

The mission given to the Church by Jesus Christ to share the Good News, must remain a deep concern for every Christian. As a community of faith we express our genuine solicitude for our brothers and sisters throughout the world, thereby enriching our universal and treasured identity as His disciples. Indeed, proclaiming our salvation in Christ is the message that must be etched into the very heart of every member of God's family in the whole world!
